SAINT PATRICK'S DAY

Saint Patrick's Day is celebrated on March 17, in honor of the patron saint of Ireland. Many legends have grown up about Saint Patrick. One of the best known is that he charmed the snakes of Ireland down to the seashore so that they were driven into the water and drowned. Much else that is told of Saint Patrick is little more than legendary. He left a sort of autobiography in his "confession," written in crude Latin.

His death on March 17, 493, has been observed in America since colonial days. The Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick was organized in Philadelphia. Later, in New York. Irishmen of the Roman Catholic and Presbyterian faiths organized another chapter of the society. Observance of the day since 1845 has become nationwide. It is celebrated in homes, churches, schools and places of entertainment. Merchants sell special wearing apparel, flowers, shamrocks, and greeting cards. Some cities hold parades. Each year arrangements for New York's St. Patrick's Day parade begins shortly after New Years. The organization committee enlists the help of businessmen, churches, and government officials and employees throughout the city to make the parade "a great day for the Irish."

Shamrock is the national flower of Ireland. According to legend St. Patrick planted the little plant in Ireland because its three small leaves represented the Holy Trinity. All loyal sons of Ireland still wear a shamrock in their lapels on St. Patrick's Day.

JACKIE DISMUKE WINS BETTY CROCKER
AWARD

Jackie Dismuke is winner in our school in the 1962 Betty Crocker Search for the American Homemaker of Tomorrow. She achieved the highest score in the examination on homemaking knowledge and attitudes taken by senior girls December 5. She becomes eligible now along with winners in other state high schools, for the title of State Homemaker of Tomorrow.

The girl named State Homemaker of Tomorrow is provided a \$1,500 scholarship by General Mills, sponsor of the program. The state runner-up will receive a \$500 scholarship.

In addition, the State Homemaker of Tomorrow and her school advisor will join with other state winners in an expense-paid educational tour of New York City, Washington, D.C., and Colonial Williamsburg, Virginia. At the latter, the 1962 All-American Homemaker of Tomorrow will be named.

The national winner will have her scholarship raised to \$5,000 with second, third and fourth place winners being granted scholarships of \$4,000, \$3,000 and \$2,000 respectively.

The knowledge and attitude test, prepared and scored by Science Research Associates, Chicago, is the basis for selection of local and state winners with personal observation and interviews serving as factors in national judging.

The 1962 Betty Crocker Search reached another all-time high in enrollment with 406,132 girls in 12,874 schools participating. The program is now in its eighth year. By the end of this year, more than two and a half million girls will have participated and scholarship awards will have totaled more than three quarters of a million dollars.

MIKE PECK PARTICIPATES IN LEGION
ORATORICAL CONTEST

Congratulations are extended to Mike Peck for his outstanding achievement in the American Legion Oratorical Contest. His ten-minute talk on a phase of the Constitution was on the subject - "Communism, a Threat to Democracy." Mike, who is a Junior this year won first place in the Toombs County Contest in which Joy Davis of Vidalia placed second, and Larry Wilkes of Lyons placed third. They won \$15, \$10, and \$5 respectively.

In district competition which was held in Savannah on March 5, Mike competed against Richard Becker, a Senior at Jenkins High School. Again Mike was first-place winner and won \$25.

In the area contest held March 7 in Statesboro, Mike's competitor was a boy from Athens. In this contest, which the judges declared was the closest in the history of the contest, Mike won second place after a tie was declared, and then was broken on the number of points each contestant had made. Again he received \$15.

Mike plans to enter this event next year and we are pulling for him to go to State and to the National Contest.

SAVANNAH RIVER PROJECT INVADED

At approximately 9:30 EST Monday morning, March 12, 1962, five students and one, Mr. J. H. Collins entered the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission located on the Savannah River, 12 miles south of Aiken, S. C., and 15 miles southeast of Augusta, Ga. The students were immediately identified as Mary E. Lankford, Evelle Gibbs, Robert Brown, Ronald Sapp and Tommy Jordan. These people soon admitted that they were from Lyons High School and emphasized the fact that they were from Georgia.

Finally we agreed to let them tour the plant after we had them sign papers and pinned several badges on them. Several of our key men previewed them on the plant and showed them around. The only safe places for them to see were the laboratories, a microscope that magnifies things only 30,000 times, nuclear reactors, high level caves and glove boxes.

After a tour of the laboratories, we treated them to a delicious lunch while riding on a Trailways bus to view other parts of the plant, which in all totals 315 sq. miles. We delayed them long enough to show them a film and an exhibit concerning the Savannah River Project.

After this, we gave them folders and sent them on their way.
