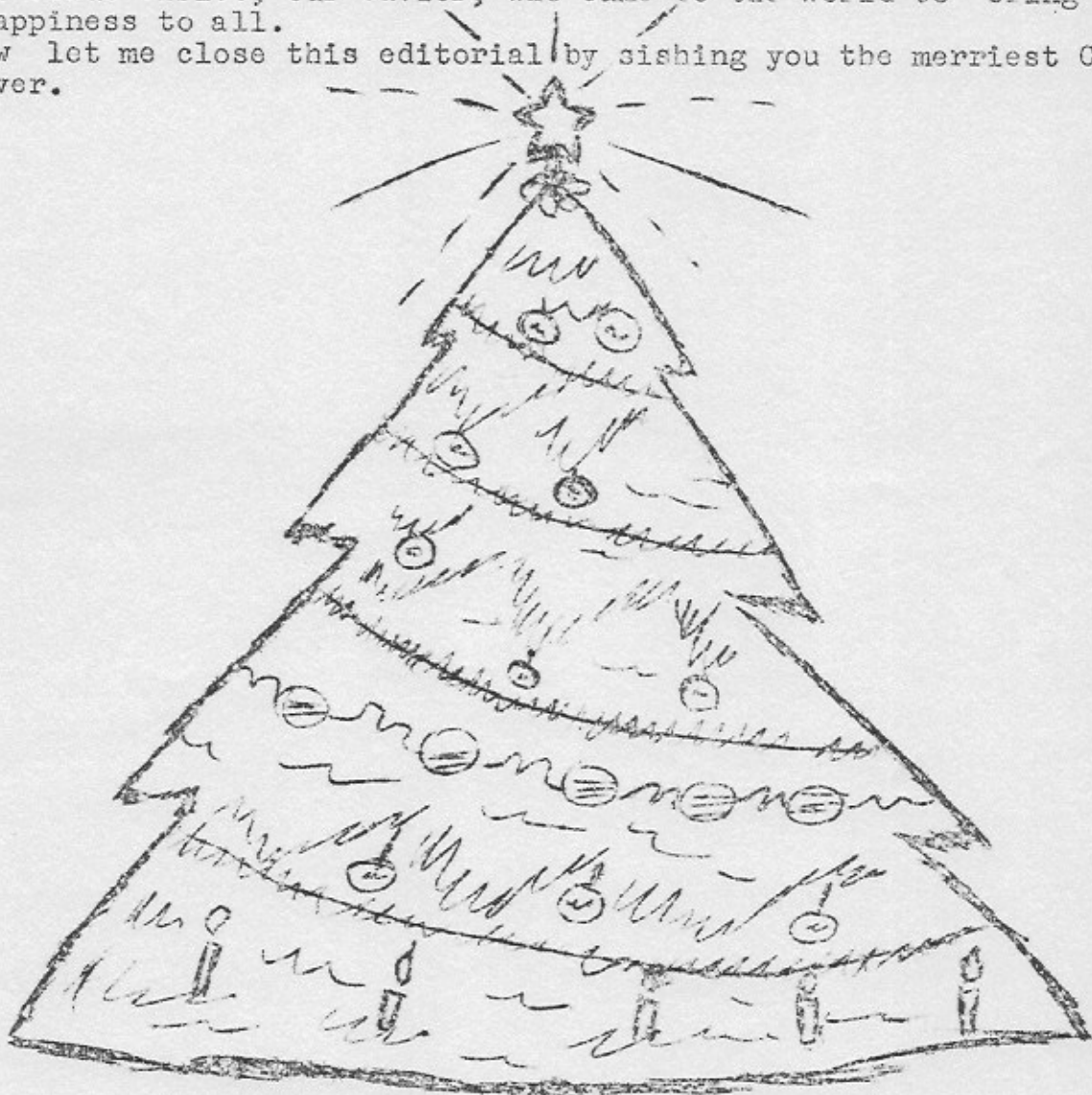
Several other tests must be taken before the winners of the scholarships are determined.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.

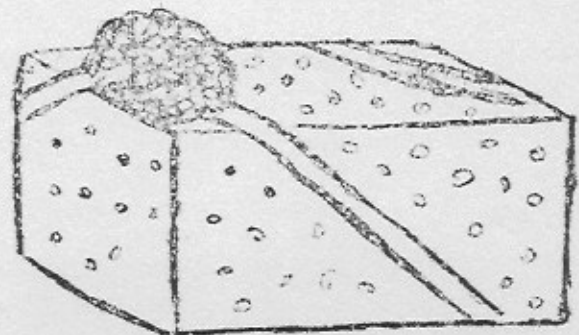
## THE MEANING OF CHRISTMAS

Time cannot wither Christmas, for it belongs to eternity. The world cannot shatter it, for it is union with Him who has overcome the world.

Unless charter and pacts have a divine sanction, unless "God is the Paramount Ruler of the world," then again and again, as the waves upon the shore, must catastrophe follow catastrophe.
