Some will go from here to college, Seeking higher education, Others, armed with high school learning, Will hegin their occupations.


It's so hard to leave our classmates, That is all that I cam say, Everyone has grown quite dear, Through our common trials each day.

We have labored through each morning, Very often with despair, But since now it's almost over, We look back with reverent care.


So we say "Farewell, dear teachers, And the rest of Lyons High," As our hearts are filled with sadness, From the schoes of "goodbye."
