WHY EDUCATION?

For many teen-agers, the best answer they can find to this question is the standard reply, "IT IS NECESSARY FOR YOUR FUTURE."

Granted, the answer is true--but it is far from adequate from the teen-ager's point of view. Other than vocational training commercial courses, high school students often find it difficult to relate their school studies to their future.

How can Jane Doe become enthused about studying Algebra when all she wants is to be an airline hostess and later a wife and mother? Or how does Joe Doe reconcile himself to better struggles with English when his one ambition is to become an electronics engineer?

The basic question is: WHY SPEND SO MUCH TIME AND EFFORT ON STUDIES WHICH SEEM TO HAVE LITTLE DIRECT CONNECTION WITH THE WORK YOU HOPE TO DO?

If you find the right answers to this question it can make your school year a great one instead of a grunt, gripe and groan ordeal. As a starter, think of your education as something more than being required to memorize a lot of facts, dates, grammatical rules and math formulae. Memorizing alone can only make you a living encyclopedia, an ability of little value by itself and not to be confused with real learning. REAL LEARNING is knowing how to use your factual knowledge so you can reason, so you can think straight about personal and public problems.

There is some value in courses, however dull. They supply much factual knowledge, some of which you will retain. And through the sheer pressure of memorizing you are force-feeding your mind, training it how to function. Perhaps in your life's work you may never need that math formula or to recall that history date, but that week-long session of tough homework on the subject gives your

mind a training workout it will never forget.

Unfortunately, our educational system often fails to explain to the young student why he is subjected to the pressures of study, exams, and learning discipline. When they cannot see the ultimate rewards for their studies--only the penalties for failure--is it any wonder they think of school as compulsory drudgery instead of an opportunity?

By this time in your school career you should have a picture of what school is all about. And I mean something more specific than, "IT IS NECESSARY FOR YOUR FUTURE."

In broad terms, the purpose of education is to help you become a more capable and more adaptable person. This means being able to accomplish more worthwhile things for the benefit of yourself, your future family and your community. It also means developing broader understanding of others so you can get along well with them in work and social life. In a nutshell, your high school studies are the foundation on which you will build your life, making it a good life or a dreary existence.

For understandable reasons, the Jane and Joe Does may find it difficult to tie in their personal plans for the future with today's tough homework assignment on English literature. But there is a connection, a two-fold connection, in fact. First, you are acquiring information on how to use the English language in speaking and writing--an absolute essential in any life's work. Second, and perhaps equally important, you become accustomed to the discipline of learning.

Knowing "WHY EDUCATION" and having the right attitude toward your studies can make the difference between a happy successful year and a wasted one to be regretted later. WHICH SHALL IT BE FOR YOU?

MALONE SHARPE SPEALS IN ASSEMBLY

As part of the Lyons Jaycees' observance of Armed Forces Appreciation Day, Malone Sharpe spoke to the students and faculty at Lyons High School on the importance of individual effort in fighting for freedom and our democratic way of life.

Mr. Sharpe's speech was one of several projects sponsored by the Jaycees in an effort to offset the anti-Viet Nam demonstrations carried on by beatnik and degenerate groups throughout the United States. He pointed out the responsibility that each of us has in preserving the liberty and freedom that our founding fathers fought for.

"Today, men speak of liberty even as it is being extinguished before our very eyes. They speak of liberty even as it is being transformed into a strange gospel. Men speak of liberty even as its domain shrinks and it struggles for survival. Men speak of liberty even as such heresies as "Better Red than Dead" arise and are embraced by those who have forgotten freedom's price. To appreciate these statements we need only realize that today Communism controls one-fourth of the earth's land area and one-third of its population, and for every one child being taught the Christian religion, there are five being taught the Godless ideology of Communism.

These realities make individual participation mandatory for the survival of freedom. Remember this freedom is not free; it is not without price. The price of freedom is eternal vigilance.

Apparently, there are some in our midst who think freedom must be defended on the East and West coasts of the United States only. But any time any man's freedom is jeopardized anywhere in the world YOUR freedom is also in danger. His fight is your fight. His fate is your fate.

What must we do? We must become involved. We must stop feeling that it is the other person's responsibility. Who are we going

to make mad? The Atheist? The Socialist? The Communist? Well, I don't want to be popular with them. Every man and woman has a vital stake in freedom and no one can protect his individual freedom by sitting in a chair, under a hair-dryer, or on a golf course. The place to defend liberty is in our normal everyday and regular pursuits.

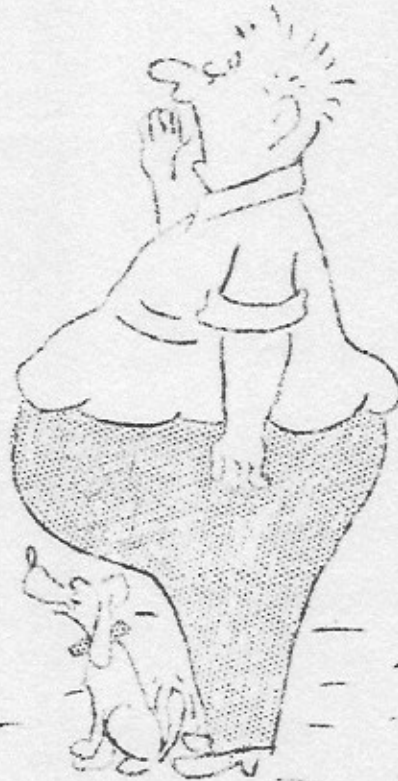
