

#### BETA CLUB


The Beta Club of the Lyons High School held their annual initiation of the new members recently.

After four plunges at the line with no gain, Metter took over. Then, after three unsuccessful attempts to come up with the ball, Metter punted, but Alton James blocked the kick and Sonny Graham carried it to the end zone for a 6-0 score On the next exchange of downs,

Himmy Collins pushed through a thin hole in the line and sped 45 yards for the second touchdown. Extra point was also mide by Collins.
